



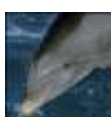
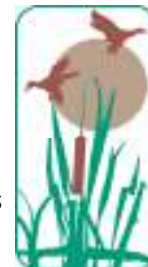

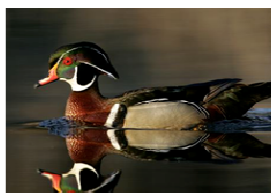
The Horicon Marsh Story
